AUDITORY LEARNERS



How They Learn:

These children understand best by hearing. They remember lessons from spoken words, music, and discussion.

- Audio prayers and songs inspired by the Ethiopian Orthodox tradition
- Guided discussions for families or small groups
- Podcasts and storytelling sessions featuring saints like Saint Teklehaimanot

How You Can Help:

- Listen together and ask them to retell the story
- Use chants and hymns during prayer time
- Encourage them to talk about what they learned after a lesson

VISUAL LEARNERS



How They Learn:

Visual learners remember best through images, diagrams, and colorful scenes.

Our resources include:

- Illustrated Bible stories and Saint biographies
- Icon-based learning tools and printable visuals
- Video lessons with animations and captions
- Saint Teklehaimanot sketches and storyboards

How You Can Help:

- Point to pictures or icons while reading
- Let them draw what they learned
- Watch our short Bible animations together

READING/WRITING LEARNERS



How They Learn:

These learners prefer reading texts and writing notes to process information deeply.

Our resources include:

- Age-based Bible study booklets
- Printable Synaxarium stories in simple language
- Worksheets and reflection prompts
- Scripture memory activities and saint timelines

How You Can Help:

- Give them quiet time to read and reflect
- Ask them to journal what they learn
- Encourage highlighting or note-taking during lessons
